We are seeking a colleague with interdisciplinary competences in the biogeophysical sciences. The ideal candidate would have developed proficiency related to earth systems science, human use of resources and current sustainability challenges. Preference will be given to applicants with teaching and field school experience. The position includes participation in administration and outreach activities of the unit, as well as responsibility for the following courses: ENVS 1100 and 1200 (Foundations and Challenges in Environmental Science), ENVS 2100 (Environmental Informatics), ENVS 3001 (Field School), ENVS 3601 (Biogeochemical Cycles), and one additional upper level course based on the unit's requirements and the successful applicant's experience.

**Instructor (50% Part-time, 1-Year Limited Term Appointment)**

We are seeking a colleague with interdisciplinary competences in the human dimensions of environmental science. We seek a scholar with excellent teaching records suited to student directed, interdisciplinary and experiential learning as applied to problem solving as applied to current environmental challenges. Preference will be given to applicants with teaching and field school experience. The position includes responsibility for the following courses: ENVS 3501 (Environmental Problem Solving), ENVS 3502 (Environmental Problem Solving II - Greening the Campus) and ENVS 2000 (Urban Field School) and participate in administration and outreach activities of the unit.

Applicants must have a PhD, evidence of teaching effectiveness, and enthusiasm to teach in diverse settings (large and small undergraduate classes and outdoors) related to the candidate's areas of expertise.
