



**Dalhousie University, School of Communication Sciences and Disorders, Faculty of Health
Probationary Tenure Track Faculty Position**

The School of Communication Sciences and Disorders, Faculty of Health, at Dalhousie University invites applications for a full-time, probationary, tenure-track, faculty position whose teaching and research interests are in one or more of the following areas: dysphagia, voice, resonance, fluency, child speech disorders, and/or augmentative and alternative communication.

The position requires a PhD degree, and preference will be given to applicants with teaching and/or postdoctoral experience. The appointment will be at the rank of Assistant Professor, and will begin on July 1, 2019. The successful candidate will be expected to teach graduate classes in speech-language pathology, to establish a vigorous and creative research program with external funding, to supervise student research, and to foster collaborations with clinical and research communities.
