



**DIRECTOR, SCHOOL OF DENTAL HYGIENE  
FACULTY OF DENTISTRY DALHOUSIE UNIVERSITY**

The Faculty of Dentistry is seeking applications for a five-year appointment as director of the School of Dental Hygiene. This appointment will begin on July 1, 2019.

The minimum education requirement is a master's degree. Candidates are expected to have considerable didactic and clinical teaching experience with dental hygiene students and some administrative background and experience would be considered an asset. Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with the successful candidate's qualifications, experience, and achievements. Candidates must have, or be eligible for, a license to practise dental hygiene in Nova Scotia.

Responsibilities will include providing collaborative leadership for the school; ensuring the administration of dental hygiene programs; promoting excellence in education; and positively representing the School of Dental Hygiene to bodies/organizations/agencies both internal and external to the university.

The successful candidate will be an excellent communicator who is committed to the success of all students, faculty, and staff. The term for the director position is five years with the possibility of renewal, and the successful candidate will also receive an academic appointment appropriate for their qualifications.
