



Tenure-Stream Full Time Prosthodontist

The Faculty of Dentistry, Dalhousie University, is seeking applications for a full-time, probationary tenure-track or tenure-track prosthodontist at the rank of assistant or associate professor.

Preference will be given to those candidates with didactic and clinical teaching experience at the undergraduate and graduate levels in prosthodontics and a history of scholarly activity. Salary and academic rank will be commensurate with the successful candidate's qualifications, experience and achievements.

Responsibilities will include didactic, pre-clinical, and clinical teaching in all aspects of Prosthodontics in the Faculty's undergraduate programs. Broad experience with removable, fixed and implant prosthodontics is desirable. Experience with digital prosthodontic workflows would be an asset. Additional expectations include active participation in research and scholarly activity, Faculty committees and other administrative duties.

Successful applicants must be licensed or eligible for licensure through the Provincial Dental Board of Nova Scotia and must have successfully completed the National Dental Specialty Exam in Prosthodontics administered by the Royal College of Dentists of Canada. Private practice privilege is integrated with this appointment; however, the Provincial Dental Board of Nova Scotia does not offer academic licensure.
